### Graduate and professional school advising

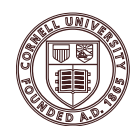
Advice and workshops on the application process and fellowships, information resources, Graduate and Professional School Days.

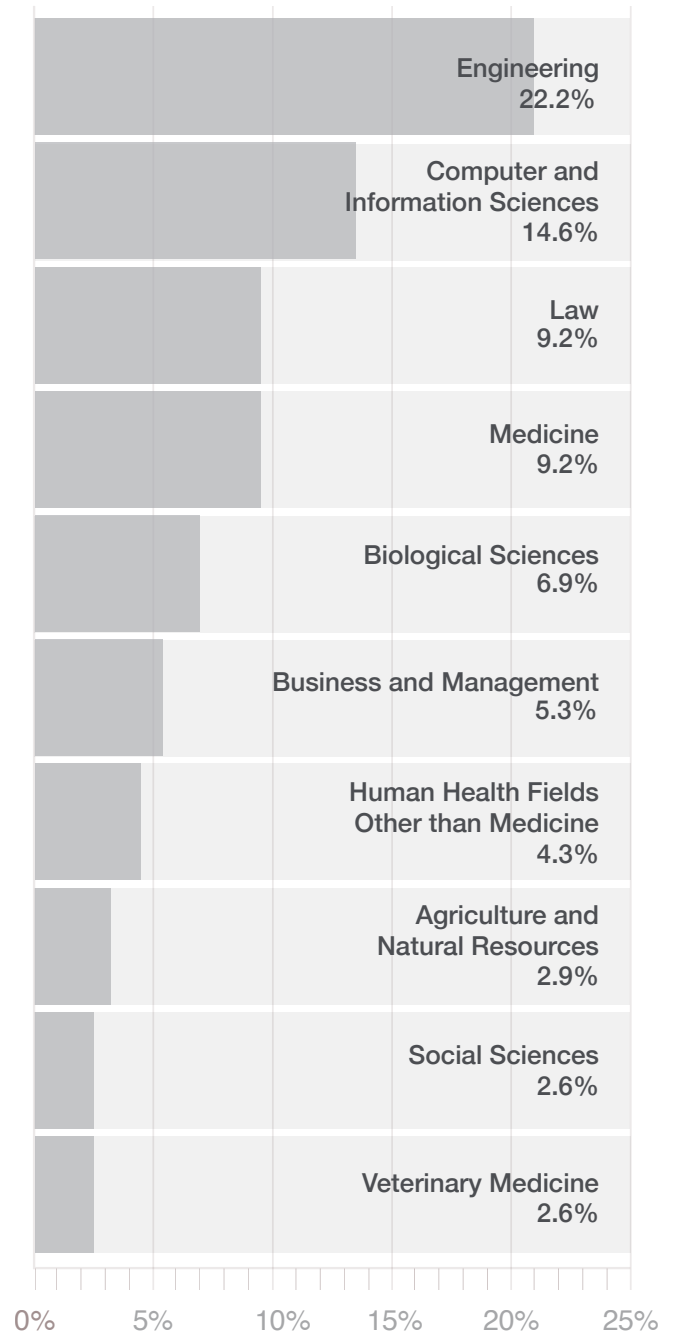

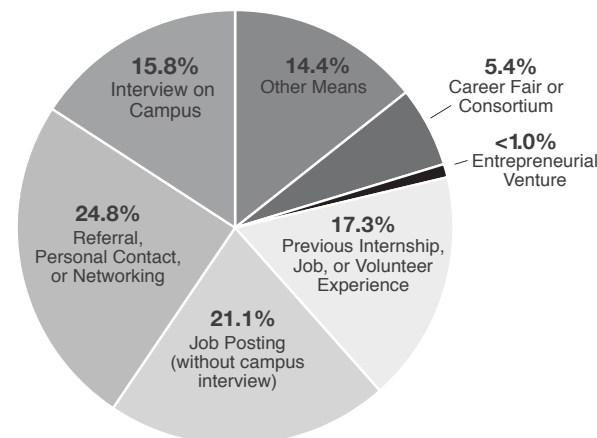

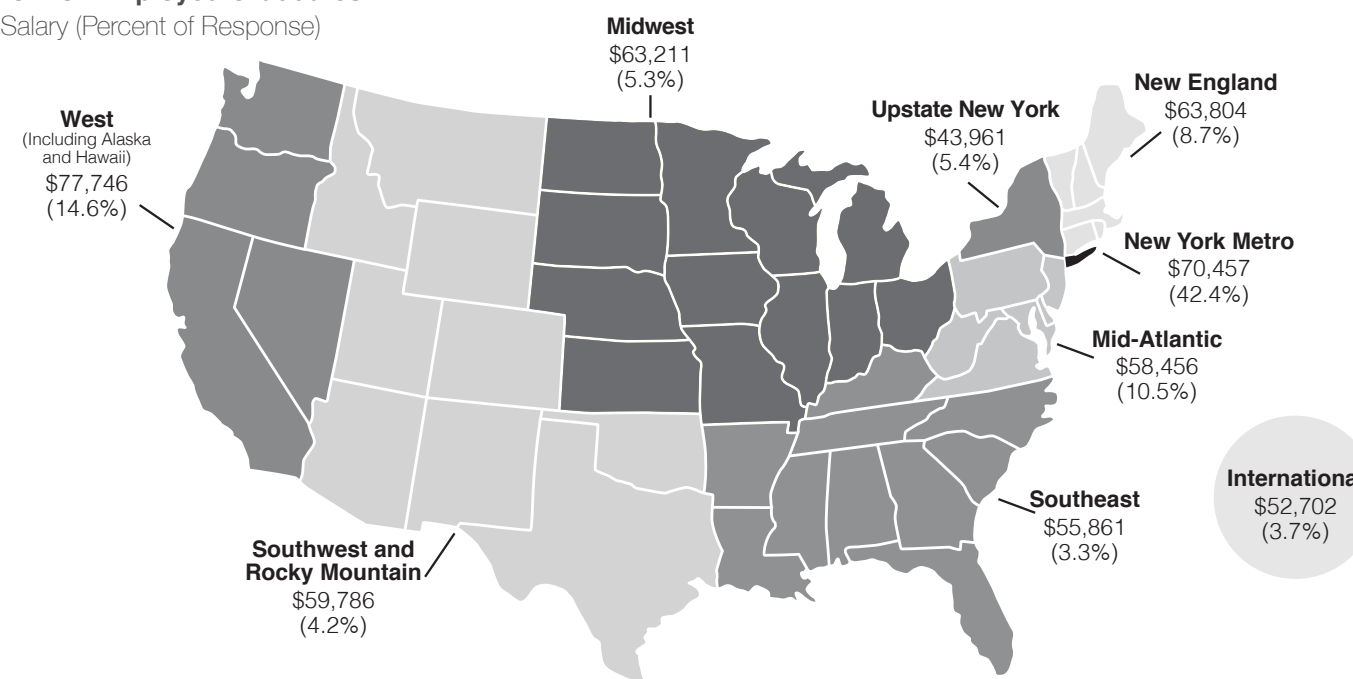
